

**MINUTES OF

The regular scheduled council meeting was held in the City Hall Conference Room Tuesday, October 3, 2023.

**I. CALL TO ORDER, INVOCATION, AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE**

Mayor Weaver called the meeting to order, City Manager Dansby gave the invocation, and Public Works Director Fravel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

**II. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve the agenda as presented. A motion was made by Councilmember Waters, seconded by Councilmember Nobles and it passed unanimously.

**III. PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

This is the time we set aside for our citizens to comment on matters. We welcome and appreciate your comments or suggestions. Our purpose is to listen to what you tell us, and we will certainly take any comments you make under advisement. We do not answer questions at this time, nor do we reply to your statements at this time. The reason for this is that an individual council member cannot and should not attempt to commit the entire council to any position, and the council should not respond until it has all the information available on a specific matter.

**Ground Rules:**

- To be placed on the agenda, you must make your request to the City Clerk or City Manager by noon on the **Thursday** prior to the meeting. If a holiday falls around the meeting date, the deadline will be noon on **Wednesday** prior to the meeting day.
- Your comments are limited to five (5) minutes.

- If you have a complaint about an employee of the City, please discuss it with the City Manager first. The City Manager will advise the Council of the matter, and an executive session may be scheduled to discuss personnel issues.
- You should avoid making any slander or defamation of someone’s character or reputation. If such comments are made, there can be legal consequences that follow since this is a public meeting.
- We prefer that you address matters that this council has the authority to deal with.

**IV. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve the consent agenda. A motion was made by Councilmember Waters, seconded by Councilmember McLeod and it passed unanimously.

**V. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF ALCOHOL BEVERAGE LICENSE APPLICATION FOR FAMILY DOLLAR FOR OFF-PREMISES CONSUMPTION OF BEER AND WINE**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve Alcohol Beverage License for Family Dollar for off-premise consumption of beer and wine. A motion was made by Councilmember Nobles, seconded by Councilmember King and it passed unanimously.

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve Resolution # 24-11 to award low bidder, Insituform Technologies, LLC., FY 2022 CDBG Sewerage System Improvements Project. A motion was made by Councilmember McLeod, seconded by Councilmember King and it passed unanimously.

**VII. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF RESOLUTION #24-12 TO APPROVE THE TATTNALL COUNTY JOINT COMPREHENSIVE PLAN**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve Resolution #24-12 to approve the Tattnall County Joint Comprehensive Plan. A motion was made by Councilmember Waters, seconded by Councilmember King and it passed unanimously.

**VIII. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL TO APPLY FOR A \$600,000 GRANT THROUGH THE GEORGIA ENVIRONMENTAL FINANCE AUTHORITY (GEFA) TO INVENTORY LEAD SERVICE LINES, TO COMPLY WITH THE BIPARTISAN INFRASTRUCTURE LAW**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve for the City to apply for a \$600,000 grant through the Georgia Environmental Finance Authority (GEFA) to inventory lead service lines, to comply with the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law. A motion was made by Councilmember McLeod, seconded by Councilmember Waters and it passed unanimously.

**IX. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL TO MAKE PART-TIME CODE ENFORCEMENT OFFICER POSITION A FULL-TIME POSITION**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to make part-time Code Enforcement Officer position a full-time position. A motion was made by Councilmember Nobles, seconded by Councilmember King and it passed unanimously.

**X. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL TO RESCHEDULE THE NOVEMBER 7, 2023 REGULAR SCHEDULED COUNCIL MEETING**

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to reschedule the November 7, 2023 regular scheduled council meeting to November 9, 2023. A motion was made by Councilmember McLeod, seconded by Councilmember Waters and it passed unanimously.

**XI. COUNCIL COMMENTS**

Councilmember King thanked to city employees and reminded everyone to check out the new comprehensive plan.

Councilmember Nobles thanked City Manager Dansby, Public Works Director Fravel, Police Chief Kicklighter, and Fire Chief Barnard for their hard work.

City Manager Dansby thanked all city employees.

Fire Chief Barnard thanked the Council and City Manager and stated the Fire Department received 10 calls for service in September totaling 20 hours and completed 8 hours of training.

Code Enforcement Officer Conley thanked the Council for making his position full-time.


