

**MINUTES OF

The regular scheduled council meeting was held in the City Hall Conference Room Tuesday, July 1, 2025.

I. CALL TO ORDER, INVOCATION, AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Mayor Weaver called the meeting to order, Councilmember Miller gave the invocation, and Councilmember Nobles led the Pledge of Allegiance.

II. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve the agenda as presented. A motion was made by Councilmember Nobles, seconded by Councilmember McLeod and it passed unanimously.

IV. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF CONSENT AGENDA

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve the consent agenda. A motion was made by Councilmember Nobles, seconded by Councilmember McLeod and it passed unanimously.

V. PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER REZONING REQUEST FOR PARCEL NO. 099 068 AT CLOVERDALE ROAD FROM AG TO R1B

- Appointment of Presiding Officer
- Public Comments
- Recommendation from Planning Commission
- Close Public Hearing

Mayor Weaver served as the presiding officer. He asked if anyone was there to speak in opposition of the rezoning. There was not anyone in attendance to speak in opposition. He then asked if there was anyone in attendance to speak in favor of the rezoning. He pointed out that Mr. Dasher, the applicant, was in attendance. With no public comments, Mayor Weaver closed the public hearing.

Mayor Weaver explained that the Planning Commission voted in favor of the rezoning.

VI. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OR DISAPPROVAL OF RESOLUTION # 26-01 REZONING OF PARCEL NO. 099 068 FROM AG (AGRICULTURE) TO R1B (LOW DENSITY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT)

Mayor Weaver asked for motion to approve Resolution #26-01 Rezoning of Parcel No. 099 068 from AG (Agriculture) to R1B (Low Density Residential District). A motion was made by Councilmember McLeod, seconded by Councilmember Nobles and it passed unanimously.

VII. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF ANNUAL MERIT RAISE FOR CITY EMPLOYEES FOR FY'26

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve annual merit raise for City employees for FY'26. A motion was made by Councilmember Miller, seconded by Councilmember Nobles and it passed unanimously.

VIII. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF MUTUAL AID AGREEMENT BETWEEN GLENNVILLE FIRE DEPARTMENT AND ROGERS STATE PRISON FOR FIRE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve Mutual Aid Agreement between Glennville Fire Department and Rogers State Prison for fire and emergency services. A motion was made by Councilmember Miller, seconded by Councilmember McLeod and it passed unanimously.

IX. DEPARTMENT UPDATE

Police Chief Kicklighter explained that for the month of June the Police Department:

- Issued 14 citations and 2 warnings
- Completed 39 incident reports and 8 accident reports
- Had 386 calls for service
- Completed 215 building checks and 285 business checks
- Arrested 5 individuals resulting in 9 misdemeanors and arrested 4 individuals resulting in 9 felonies

Police Chief Kicklighter explained that 4 of the arrests were K-9 assisted.

Fire Chief Barnard explained that the Fire Department responded to 10 calls for the month of June with 7 inside the city limits, 3 outside the city limits, and had 13.4 hours of operation.

Code Enforcement Officer Conley explained that he issued 2 building permits, 6 work permits, 3 mobile home permits, and had 1 rezoning application for the month of June.

Public Works Director Fravel explained that the water department completed 1 sewer taps and 2 sewer repairs, 1 water taps and 6 water repairs for the month of June. He then explained that the street department pick up over 100 piles of limbs and over 130 bags of leaves.

Public Works Director Fravel explained that the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) is over 90% complete and the remaining work would be completed within the next week.

X. COUNCIL COMMENTS

Chamber Director Craft thanked everyone that came to Farmers Market and explained that there would be two more on the 12th and 19th of July. She also explained that the Chamber would be hosting a Back-to-School Bash on July 26th at the elementary school and reminded everyone of Miracle Treat Day on July 31st.

Councilmember Miller thanked everyone that came the council meeting.

Councilmember Nobles thanked all the department heads for their leadership.

Mayor Weaver wished everyone a safe holiday.

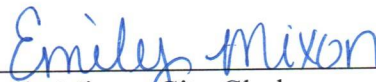
