I. CALL TO ORDER, INVOCATION, AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

II. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve the agenda as presented. A motion was made by Councilmember Waters, seconded by Councilmember Nobles and it passed unanimously.

VIII. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL TO PURCHASE 3 RADIOS FOR THE POLICE DEPARTMENT TO BE PAID FOR WITH ARPA FUNDS

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve to purchase 3 radios for the Police Department, to be paid for by ARPA Funds. A motion was made by Councilmember Miller, seconded by Councilmember Nobles and it passed unanimously.

IX. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL OF 2025 HOLIDAY SCHEDULE

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve 2025 Holiday Schedule. A motion was made by Councilmember Miller, seconded by Councilmember Waters and it passed unanimously.

X. DISCUSSION / APPROVAL TO PROVIDE PREMIUM PAY TO CITY EMPLOYEES THAT WERE EMPLOYED BETWEEN JANUARY 27, 2020 AND MARCH 3, 2021

NOTE: Premium Pay is one of the eligible uses for the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds, that all cities received due to the COVID-19 pandemic. This eligible use allows employers to pay up to \$13.00 per hour above regular wages. Treasury encourages retrospective premium pay, recognizing essential workers. Eligible time period is January 27, 2020, to March 3, 2021. The City used an average figure of \$2.18 per hour for every hour worked during the eligible time period.

Mayor Weaver asked for a motion to approve to provide premium pay to city employees that were employed between January 27, 2020 and March 3, 2021. A motion was made by Councilmember Waters, seconded by Councilmember Miller and it passed unanimously.

XI. COUNCIL COMMENTS

Councilmember Miller told everyone hello.

Councilmember Nobles thanked Police Chief Kicklighter and Lieutenant Boyd for their work with the canine program and explained that the program has been a great success.

Councilmember Waters thanked Lieutenant Boyd for catching the person that stole their bicycle and asked City Manager Dansby for an update on debris pickup.

City Manager Dansby explained that the contractors the County hired are through with the City debris and once they were completed with the County pickup, they would begin grinding the debris into mulch and clearing the drop sight.

Chamber Director Craft explained that Lamya King had a Ribbon Cutting scheduled for Thursday at 11:00 a.m. and the Celebration of the Season event was scheduled for this Friday.

Mayor Weaver thanked the City staff and wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year.
